Student Government's Members-at-Large play an important role in maintaining diversity and collaboration at Burnaby North. They are expected to hold all the same duties as all other Student Government members. No roles work in isolation; all Members-at-Large must support each others' communities.

Club Representatives liaise between clubs and Student Government and ensure that all events work in association with one another, much like the role of a VPA or VAC Rep. They also co-chair the United Federation of Clubs (UFC) with the vice president.

Diversity Representatives advocate for intersectionality in Student Government's events. For instance, at the remembrance day ceremony, they would ensure that LGBTQ+ and BIPOC initiatives are recognized. Preferably, these representatives are a part of the minority representatives they represent. However, they are responsible for advocating for **all** of the communities.
